Answer: This is only while off duty, CapMetro has another policy for on/off duty.

Comment: The community should be informed of this policy.

Officer Involved Shooting and Critical Incidents

Stephen Foster asks if there is a confidentiality agreement for officers when they divulge information during required (after a Critical Incident) mental health sessions with a counselor.

Answer: Counselors can share information with the administrative part of the department (Chief), but not investigators. The meetings are to determine what is going on with the officer mentally (such as PTSD) and counselors will let the Chief of Police know if they are in the right frame of mind to go back to work.
